

SUPPORT FUNCTIONS

Each booklet of the Plan indicates in detail the "Support Functions" which constitute the **Centro Operativo Comunale – C.O.C.**, the fulcrum of the management and operational and organizational response of Roma Capitale Civil Protection System in case of emergency and the indication of the areas of individual emergency in relation to the different types of risk.

Overall, there are 766 sites to be divided in waiting areas, hospitality areas and rescuers amassment areas (on average 50 sites in each municipality).

CARTOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

The cartographic information contained in the Plan is organized in a unified database, made up of data held by the Civil Protection and various official Open data sources, internal and external to the Administration, which will be progressively integrated, during the updates, with specific and sectoral databases.

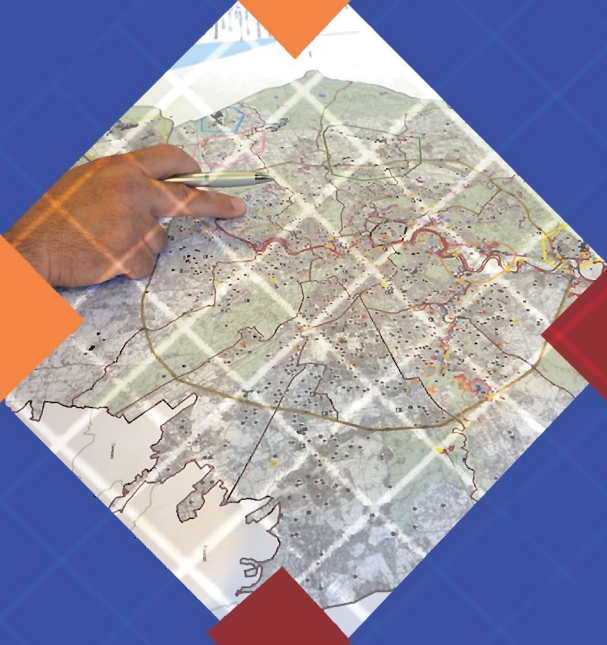

WHAT IS THE CIVIL PROTECTION PLAN

The Roma Capitale Civil Protection Plan is the organizational guidelines of operating activities to perform in order to deal with events that could negatively impact the people, environment, and property within the municipal area.

The Plan, based on risk scenarios, defines the strategies aiming at damage reduction and emergency recovery. The protection of the people, of the environment and of the assets in the risk area is the main purpose of the Plan.



THE BOOKLETS

The Plan is composed of 8 booklets, including digital maps. Each of them is an independent operating manual.

- The **first booklet** introduces general aspects of the Roma Capitale Civil Protection System;
- The **second booklet** is dedicated to the hydraulic risk scenarios for flooding of the main and secondary hydraulic network;
- The **third booklet** is dedicated to the hydrogeological hazards caused by landslides;
- The **fourth booklet** is dedicated to snow and frost hazard;
- The **fifth booklet** is dedicated to forest and interface fire hazard;
- The **sixth booklet** is dedicated to the risk of major industrial accidents;
- The **seventh booklet** is dedicated to the seismic hazard;

- The **eighth booklet** is dedicated to “other less recurring hazards”: endogenic gas release, underground caves and sinkholes, waste burning, heat waves, events and demonstrations with significant local impact and health risk.

For each booklet, it is represented the treated **risk scenario**, in relation to the resources available for the emergency, and the description of the different phases and conditions of activation and the relative action procedures for each phase:
